<p>PDL suggests that the fourth dot point in the Shared Goals list could recognise that discrimination may occur within diverse communities, This could be recognised by the additional reference as <b>highlighted</b>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>enabling interprofessional collaborative practice teams to build trust <b>without discrimination</b> with diverse communities and individuals.</li></ul> <p>PDL supports recognition of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) peoples and the reference to freedom from racism. PDL agrees with the statement that health practitioners offer culturally safe interprofessional collaborative practice to ASTI people.</p> <p>PDL also believes culturally safe interprofessional collaborative practice is an entitlement for people of all cultures and the statement should be expanded to recognise the diversity of the Australian population.</p>
