March 2024 Cosmetic Surgery Oversight Group meeting

The independently chaired Cosmetic Surgery Oversight Group (the Oversight Group) held its sixth meeting on 21 March 2024.

The Oversight Group was established by Ahpra to provide assurance to the community, governments, health practitioners and industry stakeholders that Ahpra and the Medical Board (MBA) are implementing the recommendations of the <u>Independent review of the regulation of medical practitioners who perform cosmetic surgery</u> (the independent review)

Update on implementation progress of recommendations of the independent review

Members received a progress update from Ahpra and the Medical Board of Australia in relation to progress on each of the independent review's 16 recommendations. Members noted that work on most recommendations is either complete or now embedded in Ahpra and the Medical Board's ongoing work. Four recommendations remain open – two for monitoring and two on track for completion later this year.

Cosmetic surgery enforcement unit

Members received an update on work of the Ahpra Cosmetic Surgery Enforcement Unit.

Since September 2022, the Cosmetic Surgery hotline has received 708 calls leading to 302 new notifications. Two hundred and nine of these notifications have now been resolved.

Advertising audits have shown a significant improvement with most practitioners complying with guidelines. There has also been good compliance with the changes to use of the title surgeon.

Ahpra and the Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) are working on providing consistent messaging in relation to the changes to the TGA's guidance on advertising cosmetic injectables.

Update from the Australian Commission for Safety and Quality in Health Care

Members received an update on the Commission's cosmetic surgery standards that were released on 14 December 2023. Members noted the Commission's perspective on the intersection of the work of their work with that of Ahpra and the Medical Board and future work.

Update from the Therapeutic Goods Administration

Members welcomed the Deputy Secretary of the Health Products Regulation Group (HPRG) within the Australian Government Department of Health and Aged Care which includes the TGA. Members received an update on the overview of the TGA's work in relation to non-surgical cosmetic procedures and its role in regulating medicines and medical devices and subsequent advertising.

Regulation of non-surgical cosmetic procedures

Members noted that public consultation on the draft guidelines for non-surgical cosmetic procedures closed on 1 March 2024. Members received an update on early analysis of numbers, types of submissions and emerging themes.
