I am a member of the Australian public, and I am a Team Leader in Community Mental Health Services, **Sector 1**, **Constitution**. The goal of bringing in some overseas trained SIMGs (Specialist International Medical Graduates) from competent pathway countries into Australia and <u>within 6 months</u> granting them specialist recognition is welcomed and a good idea in principle and I support it. This is to continue alongside with the Fellowship programs awarded by the Specialist Colleges. From Aphra's newsletter the medical specialties with critical of shortages are GPs, anaesthetics, obstetrics and psychiatrists and the aim of this proposed idea is to provide the Australian population with more specialists and reduce wait times of seeing a specialist.

APHRA must be aware of a group of Australian SIMGs(Specialist IMGs)who have been in this system for more 5 years and some up to 20 years or more and include them in the proposed fast tracked pathway to specialist recognition.

These cohort of doctors(Australian SIMGs) have the following peculiar advantages in that they

- have previously been in the Specialist Pathway of AHPRA, and their overseas specialist qualifications had been validated by the Specialist Colleges as being <u>comparable</u> (partial and substantial). It's unfortunate that they could not achieve their Fellowship on time for some reasons.

- These cohort of Australian SIMGs have previously and currently work in the Australian health system in senior medical positions and should be considered in the fast tracked/ expedited pathway to specialist recognition.

Their specialist recognition under the fast-tracked pathway can lead to more efficient and coordinated care for patients in Australia.

These cohort of doctors are Australian citizens and permanent residents and had been practising in a culturally competent manner and they are well equipped and experienced with the operations of the Australian Health System having worked in Australia for many years.

This email is to request It's only **just and fair** to include these cohort of Australian SIMGs into the fast tracked or expedited pathway to specialist recognition.
