The Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (Ahpra) and the 15 National Boards work in partnership to ensure Australia's registered health practitioners are suitably trained, qualified and safe to practise. Public safety is our priority.

Did You know?

At 30 June 2023, there were **19,359** registered health practitioners in Tasmania, across 16 professions. The top 3 professions are nurses (10,941), doctors (2,941) and Pharmacists (890).



Know who you're seeing about your healthcare

You can check our <u>Register of practitioners</u> to see if someone is registered and whether there are any special requirements on their registration. You can search by their name, profession, postcode, gender and/or language spoken.





In focus: BluePrint for reform - Protecting Patients from sexual misconduct and Prioritising community voices

Ahpra has developed a plan to better protect patients from sexual misconduct in healthcare, including providing more information on the public register when a practitioner has a proven history of sexual misconduct. Australia's health ministers support this blueprint, which also includes prioritising community voices in regulatory decision making.
